## Violin

**Ms. Jan High** is a certified violin instructor and plays with the Merrimack Valley Symphony Orchestra. Children, ages 6 to 12 learn to play the violin using the Suzuki teaching method. Instruments are rented from Trinity Church. Lessons are mostly offered in group settings to encourage children to learn together. Recital opportunities are offered two times during the program year.



## Flute / Recorder

**Pastor Melissa Yosua-Davis** teaches flute and recorder. She has been playing the flute since the 5th grade and has orchestra experience both in high school in an award winning jazz ensemble and at Colby College. Children in grades 1 to 4 receive instruction on the recorder, Grades 5 and up may receive instruction on the flute.



## Art

**Lilli Leggio** serves as director of communications and admissions at Esperanza Academy. She uses recycled and found objects to help children see the endless possibility for beauty and art in their environment. Lilli created a summer program at *Si Se Puede* that introduced children to world cultures using film, food, art, and language.



## Guitar

**Mr. Dave Talmage and Ms. Donna Talmage** team up to offer instruction in guitar, drums, and harmonica. Dave plays in local music venues across New England. Donna is a children's librarian at the Haverhill Library and brings much humor and love to our program. Both Dave and Donna love folk music and the instructional pieces reflect that passion. The children come away with a sense of pride and accomplishment in their music abilities and a love for just playing together.

## Piano

**The Rev Ben Yosua-Davis and Ms Janice Davis** offer piano instruction. Ben is a church musician as well as co-pastor of The Vine. Jan is a retired Methodist pastor and piano teacher who loves music and loves kids. New this year is a fun group experience for beginners to learn the basics of music together. One-on-one teaching is available for more advanced students. Piano instruction is popular and a waiting list is the norm.



## Drama

**Ms. Nancy Morrissey and Mr. Sean Gaff** are our drama instructors. Ms. Morrissey has acted in, run lights for, and been production manager in various community theater productions. She is a seamstress for a national costume firm. Mr. Gaff has been singing and performing on-stage for 25 years and has directed many school musicals. He attended Trinity as a child and is excited to be back as a teacher. Children will participate in a variety of modules which will cover all the basics of theatre leading to performance, including acting, singing, dance, costumes, sets, lighting, etc.



## Joyful Noise Chorus

**Dr. Janet King** leads the Joyful Noise Chorus, and is the Program Director for ACAT and FEAST. Choir members will have fun singing together, learning both by using their ears and by reading notes. We also work on respect, cooperation and healthy singing methods. Dr. King is a life-long singer who has taught university students in Colorado and sung opera in Europe. She has recently returned to Massachusetts in order to lead the music programming at Trinity Church.
